

Course Overview

The Movement System was adopted as the identity of physical therapy as one of the 8 guiding principles accompanying the Vision Statement of 2013. As suggested by the kinesiopathologic concept of movement inducing pathology, physical therapists can address the cause of neuromusculoskeletal problems and not just symptoms or consequences such as the pathoanatomic problem. Medical professionals, including physical therapists, should expect to achieve enhanced clinical reasoning and diagnostic/referral skills for patients with or without referral.
